Opposite Words

Habitat and Adaptation

Through this fun and interactive method, learners not only strengthened their science concepts but also developed IB skills such as communication, critical thinking, and collaboration. They integrated physical education with science, showing how learning can be both active and meaningful.



Magical Activity on Creating Colourful Bubbles



IB PYP learners of Grade 1 and 2 conducted a magical activity on creating colourful bubbles through a simple science experiment. Using food colours, water, soap, and reused bottles, they explored how air and liquid interact to form bubbles. This hands-on task encouraged observation, prediction, and comparison skills as learners noticed the size, colour, and shape of bubbles. They also demonstrated thinking skills by experimenting with different mixtures and communication skills by sharing their findings. The activity fostered creativity, curiosity, and an appreciation for reusing materials, aligning with the IB learner profiles of being inquirers and reflective thinkers. Rocket Creation



Learners from Grades 3 to 5 showcased creativity and scientific curiosity by designing rockets using discarded plastic bottles. Emphasizing the importance of reusing materials, the young innovators turned waste into wonder. To launch their rockets, they used a simple yet exciting chemical reaction — mixing vinegar and baking soda to create pressure. The fizzing reaction propelled the rockets skyward, sparking enthusiasm and awe among everyone present. The activity not only demonstrated basic principles of science but also encouraged sustainable practices and teamwork.



Role Play on "How Animals Sense"

Grade 5 learners brought the theme How Animals Sense to life through a creative role-play activity. Wearing self-made animal masks of lions, tigers, deer, and vultures, they confidently shared unique features, sense organs, and communication methods of their chosen animals. The activity honed research, communication, and presentation skills while fostering creativity and critical thinking. It deepened understanding of animal adaptations, celebrated biodiversity, and reflected the IB learner profiles of Communicators, Knowledgeable, and Thinkers.



Animal Kingdom



Grade 5 learners explored the Animal Kingdom through an enriching project file activity. Each student researched a specific animal group—mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds, insects, or aquatic animals—documenting key features, body structures, reproduction, food habits, and special adaptations. The activity enhanced their understanding of classification while building research, note-making, and presentation skills. By organizing findings in project files, students developed conceptual clarity, appreciation of biodiversity, and IB learner profiles of Inquirers, Knowledgeable, and Reflective.
